Johann Herbst (1735-1812) was a Moravian minister and composer who began his career in his native Germany and later moved to America in 1786. In addition to composing 100 anthems and 200 sacred songs, he also collected and copied music from other composers into an anthology containing over 1000 pieces. *God Was in Jesus*, based on II Cor. 5:19, was written for the Saturday before Easter. A dotted rhythmic accompaniment is heard throughout the piece while the choir sings in four-part harmony chorale-style.
