#### ***God Calls Us to a Life of Service***

The Call: Deuteronomy 6:5; Mark 12:29-31

The Commitment: SERVE Litany:

Leader: Serve participants, this year at SERVE you are being called to “Love God, Love the World.” The theme verses from Luke 4:18-19 will guide you as you carry out your mission, “The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor.”

This congregation sends you out into this city with these words of encouragement:

**Congregation: Always remember you are not doing this in your own power, but in the power of the Holy Spirit.**

SERVE Participants: We claim the promise of the Spirit's presence, “But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.” (Acts 1:8)

**Congregation: During this week, look for opportunities to share the good news of Jesus Christ in word and deed.**

SERVE Participants: We will boldly proclaim the good news, “For I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God that brings salvation to everyone who believes.” (Romans 1:16)

**Congregation: Many people you meet this week will be imprisoned emotionally, financially, socially, and spiritually. Help them find freedom in Christ.**

SERVE Participants: We promise to help those in bondage find freedom in Jesus who is the truth that sets us free and, “if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed.” (John 8:36)

**Congregation: Others you meet will be blinded by the darkness of deception, hopelessness, and trials. Help them find the light of Christ.**

SERVE Participants: With the Spirit's help, we will shine the light of Christ who promises, “I have come into the world as a light, so that no one who believes in me should stay in darkness.” (John 12:46)

**Congregation: Too many people struggle with injustice or oppression. Point them to the hope of God's sovereign care and abiding presence.**

SERVE Participants: This is the good news we will share, “we know that suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope. And hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us.” (Romans 5:3-5)

Leader: Answer the call to love God and love the world knowing you go with the prayers and blessing of this congregation.

This morning we welcome **Rev. Ron Radcliffe** to our service.

Rev. Radcliffe is the church planter for City Chapel.

**Music at LaGrave:** In 2008, Carolyn Hamlin, organist at First Baptist Church in Easley, South Carolina, was honored for 50 years of service to her church. Hamlin is also a composer of organ, piano, and choral music. Her arrangement of the 19<sup>th</sup> century gospel hymn *More Love to Thee, O Christ* was dedicated to internationally-known organist, the late Carlo Curley. William H. Doane, composer of the hymn tune, was an industrialist, philanthropist, and strong supporter of the Dwight L. Moody evangelistic campaign; he also endowed the Moody Bible Institute in Chicago. He, like Hamlin, expressed his deep faith through composing music, with over 2200 hymn tunes to his credit.

The flowers on the chancel today are given by **BJ Whigham** in loving memory of husband **Peter Shore Whigham** and son Peter Allen Whigham.

**The June special offering** is for the Patient Assistance Fund (PAF) at Pine Rest. The PAF is available to individuals and families in our community who come to Pine Rest for care but have limited resources to pay for treatment. The number of people we can help each year depends on the generosity of our donors.

**In this evening's service**, Rev. Jonker will preach on Mark 6:30-44. His sermon is titled “Sitting on the Grass with Jesus.”
