Pott**, originally from Cutlerville, is currently Director of Music & Arts at Asylum Hill Congregational Church in Hartford, Connecticut, Assistant Music Director for the Hartford Chorale (a 170-voice symphonic choir), and is a member of the music faculty at Central Connecticut State University. ### **Music at LaGrave**

Dan Burgess is a composer, arranger, orchestrator, and music clinician in the contemporary Christian music scene. With over 150 songs to his credit, one of his most well-known songs is *Press On*, nominated for a 2002 Dove Award. Based on Philippians 3:14, this powerful song calls us to persevere through trials and difficulty and to “press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called us heavenward.” Echoed in the refrain, these words are pronounced by a key change in the final refrain.
