Music at LaGrave (11:00): The text of the hymn *The God of Abraham Praise* dates back to the 12th century and is based on a Jewish doxology. Two centuries later a metrical version

of that doxology was written. 18th century Englishman Thomas Olivers heard that version sung by a cantor in London and prepared an English paraphrase in twelve stanzas, of which he stated: “I have rendered it from the Hebrew, giving it, as far as I could, a Christian character.” He then asked the cantor to write a synagogue melody suited to his text and to a congregation, the melody we find in our hymnals and in Philip Gehring’s anthem.

The September special offering is for the Pregnancy Resource Center which provides education, counseling and services at no cost to the recipients. Through their variety of programs, the Pregnancy Resource Center lives out their mission “to show the truth that all people matter to God.”
