### **Music at LaGrave**

Irish poet Cecil Frances Alexander (1818-1895) wrote *There Is a Green Hill Far Away* as part of a project to teach children

the articles of the Apostles' Creed. This hymn text, based on the article “suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and buried” was reportedly written while sitting at the bedside of a sick child. Contemporary English composer Bob Chilcott's arrangement of this hymn is from an extended work (*St. John's Passion*) patterned after J. S. Bach's *Passions* in which the story is narrated by an evangelist and the choir sings chorales/hymns.
