### **Music at LaGrave**

The “sending” text of John Rutter’s anthem *Go Forth into the World in Peace* is from the 1928 *Book of Common Prayer*, used widely in the Anglican Church. An early choral work of Rutter, the anthem includes hallmarks of his compositional style: flowing, pleasing melodic lines, unison voices evolving into full harmony, phrases with increasing intensity leading into a full climax, and a meditative conclusion with a peaceful “Amen.”
