The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them up to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right for us to give thanks and praise.

With joy we praise you, gracious God, for you
created heaven and earth, made us in your image,
and kept covenant with us—even when we fell into sin.

**We give you thanks for Jesus Christ, our Lord,
who by his life, death, and resurrection opened to us
the way of everlasting life.**

We praise you that Jesus gave himself to us as the
bread of life,

**the living bread from heaven through which we are given
strength for today and bright hope for tomorrow.**

Therefore we join our voices with all the saints and angels
and the whole creation to proclaim the glory of your name:

**Worthy is the Lamb, who was slain, to receive power
and wealth and wisdom and strength and honor
and glory and praise!**

The Institution

The Prayer of Consecration

Lord, our God, send your Holy Spirit so that
this bread and cup may be for us the body and
blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. May we and all
your saints be united with Christ and remain
faithful in hope and love. Gather your whole church, O Lord,
into the glory of your kingdom. We pray this in the name of
Jesus, who taught us to pray saying:

**Our Father, who art in heaven
hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come,
thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our debts,
as we forgive our debtors.**

**And lead us not into temptation,
but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom, and the power,
and the glory, forever, Amen.**

The Communion

*When directed by a server, please come forward if you are
able. To participate in communion by intinction, take the
bread, then dip the bread in the cup. Servers will say, "The
body of Christ broken for you" and "The blood of Christ shed
for you". You may respond to each with "Thanks be to God,"
"Amen,"s or your short personal reply of gratitude. Gluten-
free and regular bread are both available at the station on the
far left/east. If you are unable to come forward, a server will
come to you in your pew. Non-communicant children are
welcome to come forward for a blessing from either pastor.
While communion is served, the congregation will sing the
following hymns:*
