Music at LaGrave (11:00): Hope College graduate Susan Bentall Boersma has written a poignant text addressing a yearning to see God, the One who came to earth to “visit his own,” and the hope of Emmanuel’s return in the second Advent. Contemporary composer Craig Courtney’s gift of writing lyrical melodies and his extensive piano background are evident in his beautiful anthem based on Boersma’s text. Following a dramatic climax near the conclusion, the anthem concludes quietly with an extended single pitch, symbolizing our waiting and yearning for God.
