### **Music at LaGrave (8:40)**

The text of the hymn *Sweet the Moments, Rich in Blessing* was penned by an 18<sup>th</sup>-century English clergyman and later altered by yet another English clergyman. American composer K. Lee Scott's choral arrangement includes four of the original five stanzas and is based on an 18<sup>th</sup>-century Moravian melody. The simple tune, made up of mostly quarter-note rhythm, allows the message of the poignant text to be clearly heard and understood.
