Music at LaGrave (11:00)

Leo Sowerby (1895-1968) was born in Grand Rapids, Michigan, attended St. Mark’s Episcopal Church, and began composing at age 10. His career included teaching composition at the American Conservatory in Chicago and posts at Chicago’s St. James Episcopal Church and Washington National Cathedral. He is most remembered for his choral and organ works. Stylistically, his anthem based on Psalm 121 is like that of much late 19th-early 20th century choral music with lyrical and, at times, chromatic melodic lines and late-Romantic harmony.

Today's flowers were provided by **Bill Stroo** and the **Glover family (Tom, Heidi [Stroo], Hannah, Hillary, and Dirk)** in loving memory of **Marilyn Stroo**, who passed away May 7, 2016. Baptism Parament: The sacrament of Baptism is the sign of God’s covenant relationship with his people. Water is the primary symbol used in baptism. The parament is designed

as a cascading waterfall symbolizing the washing away of our sins through the blood of Jesus Christ. A golden thread is woven in from top to bottom reminding us that God is with us from the beginning to the end of our lives and through all eternity. The crystal sparkles symbolizes the light of the Holy Spirit that guides us in every moment of our lives. The seashell holds the baptism water. The seashell has been used for baptism by the Christian church since the earliest centuries.
