## **Music at LaGrave:**

One writer once referred to Irish poet Thomas Moore as “one of the strangest of all men to write hymns.” Because Moore is best known for his secular ballads such as *The Last Rose of Summer* and *Believe Me if All Those Endearing Young Charms*, the public became shocked by his sacred poems. *Come, Ye Disconsolate* was originally titled *Relief in Prayer*, and the current text has been greatly altered.

Terre Johnson's contemporary choral setting of this hymn captures the consoling text through consonant harmonies and a flowing piano accompaniment.

The flowers on the chancel are given in loving memory of my husband **Tom** who moved to his heavenly home June 4, 2016. We can only imagine the beautiful music he is making in heaven.
