The nations shall come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your rising. And they shall call you the City of the Lord, O Zion of the Holy One of Israel. (Refrain)

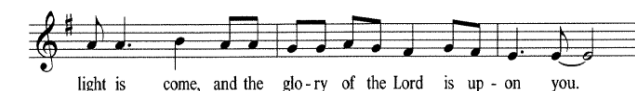
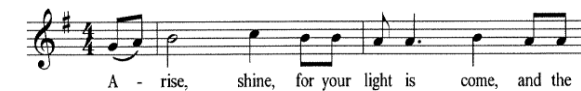
Lift up your eyes round about and see: all gather themselves together; and they shall come, your sons from afar and your daughters shall be carried at your side.

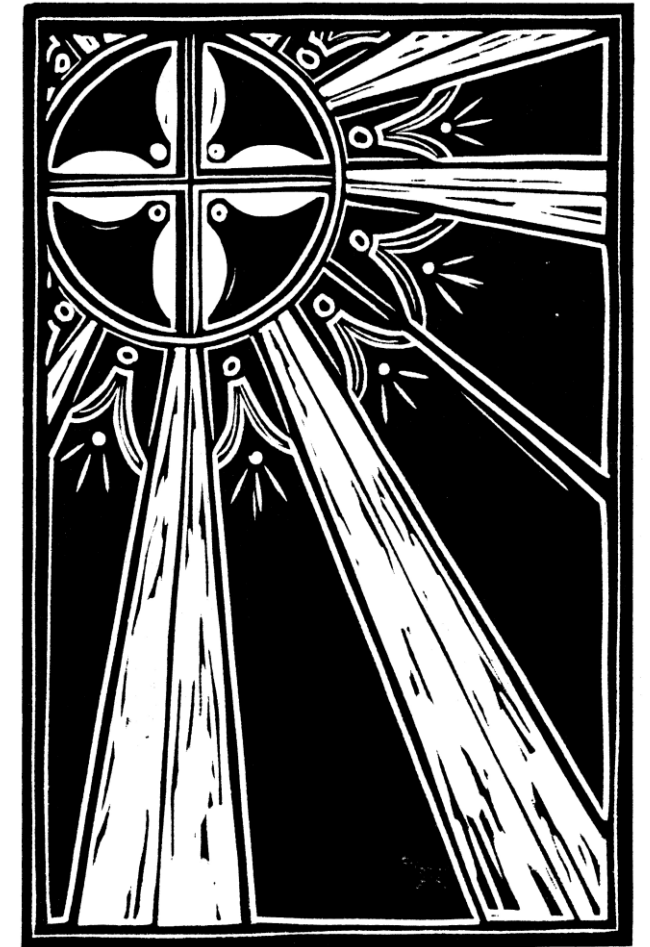
