Music at LaGrave

Timothy Dudley-Smith's paraphrase of I Corinthians 13 has captured the interest of many composers, including Michael Joncas, a composer well known in the Catholic church.

Joncas is a master at writing pleasing, lyrical melodies. Both the melody of the verse and the repeated refrain feature ascending pitches, and the phrase “May love be ours, Lord” is sung three times at each appearance of the refrain.

Through this music, the words of the apostle Paul describing “the most excellent way” become our own personal prayer.

The April special offering is for Family Promise of Grand Rapids. Family Promise partners with local congregations, individuals, families, foundations and corporations to provide emergency shelter and case management for families with children facing a housing crisis.
