*To symbolize the death of Jesus, the Christ candle was removed

in the grave, the candle remained absent from the front of the church.  
This morning, to celebrate Jesus’ resurrection, the candle is  
restored. “The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not


#### **Music at LaGrave**

This morning's two anthems are separated by nearly 500 years. The Easter hymn *O Sons and Daughters Let Us Sing* originated in 15<sup>th</sup> century France and was penned in Latin by a Franciscan friar, Jean Tisserand. The hymn begins with a series of unison Alleluias, and each verse ends with the same four-part Alleluia refrain. British composer Philip Stopford's *Christ the Lord Is Risen Again* was written in 2013 and also includes joyful Alleluias, at times heard in succession by each of the four voices.

**The April special offering** is for Family Promise of Grand Rapids. Family Promise partners with local congregations, individuals, families, foundations and corporations to provide emergency shelter and case management for families with children facing a housing crisis.

**There will not be a service this evening.**

**Easter** is the glorious celebration of Jesus' victory over sin and death. The colors white and gold are used in the paraments and banners. They symbolize our hope of new life in Jesus Christ. The crystals symbolize the light brought into the world by the risen Jesus Christ as well as his exaltation as Lord and King.
