Music at LaGrave

Thomas Pollock (1836-1896) first studied medicine at Trinity College, Dublin, Ireland, but later chose theology and was ordained in the Church of England where he worked among the poor. He also wrote metrical litanies, sectional poems, each

stanza of which concluded with the same line. *Jesus, with Thy Church Abide* originally had 18 stanzas, but is condensed to four or five in hymnals. Jonathan Tuuk composed an original tune for this hymn text and dedicated his anthem to the choir of Immanuel Lutheran Church in Grand Rapids where he once served as organist and director of music. The words *We beseech thee, hear us* conclude each stanza as a prayer for the church.
