### **Music at LaGrave**

A newspaper man-turned clergyman, American Washington Gladden (1836-1918) gained national prominence from his pastorates and for his strong role in issues of social justice. Of his hymn text *O Master, Let Me Walk with Thee*, Gladden explained the text “had no liturgical purpose,” but rather was intended as “an honest cry of human need, of the need for divine companionship.” The solo arrangement of this hymn by American composer Dale Wood (1934-2003) changes the hymn meter of 3/4 to 4/4 and embellishes the melody slightly in the final two stanzas.
