Music at LaGrave:

Alfred Fedak (b. 1953) has been called “one of the country’s leading church musicians.” A Hope College grad, Fedak has composed over 300 choral and organ works and more than 100 hymn tunes appear in modern hymnals. He is currently organist at a Reformed church in Scotia, New York. Fedak’s solo anthem *You Are the Chosen of the Lord* sets the words of Colossians 3:12-17 and was written for use at a wedding. The apostle Paul’s words call us to a holy life of compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, patience, forgiveness, and above all, love.
