Music at LaGrave:

Though little is known about composer, teacher, and pianist Olive Dungan (1903-1997), she is remembered for only a handful of pieces, including the solo *Eternal Life* based on the Prayer of St. Francis of Assisi. The lyrical vocal line has a rising contour on key words of the text such as “peace, love, pardon, faith, hope, light, joy,” and at the piece's conclusion as it leads up to the final phrase: “it is in dying that we are born to eternal life.”
