### **Music at LaGrave (8:40):**

Frances Havergal (1836-1879) wrote of her hymn text *Lord, Speak to Me That I May Speak*, “It is not what we do in our own strength; it is how we respond to God’s work within us. God speaks to us, so we may speak to others; he seeks after us, so we may seek after others.” This, to Havergal, was the secret of Christian service. J.E. Roberts’ setting of this text

does not use the familiar tune we associate with this hymn; rather, he composed his own original melody and harmony.
