### **Music at LaGrave:**

Many of us associate the hymn *Just As I Am* with the altar call on Billy Graham’s crusade broadcasts. This hymn was written

by Charlotte Elliott fourteen years after a minister came to visit her in her early 30s when suffering from a serious illness. He asked if she had peace with God, but she resented the question. Days later she apologized. The minister answered, “Come just as you are.” It is not until we confess our sins that the Lamb of God is ready to “welcome, pardon, cleanse, relieve.” The hymn is sung this morning to the traditional English melody, *O Waly Waly*.
