Music at LaGrave (11:00)

Leo Nestor (b. 1948) is currently a music professor at The Catholic University of American in Washington, DC. The National City Christian Church in Washington, DC commissioned Nestor to compose a choral triptych of three American hymn tunes in 2002. The third movement in the triptych is a large-scale setting of the hymn *Come, Thou Fount* in which the organ plays a major role. The anthem

includes a fourth stanza not printed in most hymnals, and concludes with a powerful and soaring six-fold Amen.
