Music at LaGrave

When once asked to summarize the essential truths of the Christian faith, theologian Karl Barth stated, “Jesus loves me, this I know, for the Bible tells me so.” Written in 1859, this hymn was penned by Anna Warner and was included in a novel co-written with her sister, Susan. The text was a poem of comfort spoken to a dying child. This morning, we hear the hymn sung by three children who are nieces of Carmen Kruyf, and played by instrumentalists during the offering.

The special offering for the month of July is for Westminster Food Pantry. The downtown food pantry provides an emergency supply of food and personal care items to people in need while also promoting self-sufficiency through referrals and education.
