Music at LaGrave: The theme of water is expressed through both the first prelude piece and the postlude this morning. The great J. S. Bach, in his baptism chorale prelude *Christ, Our Lord, to Jordan Came*, paints a picture of the cascading waves of the Jordan river through perpetual fast sixteenth notes which rise and fall. The text of the hymn *Oh, the Deep, Deep Love of Jesus* describes the cleansing waters of Jesus' love shown through baptism as "a mighty ocean... the current of [his] love...an ocean vast of blessing.

Tomorrow, October 10, 2022 marks the 102nd anniversary of the installation of Dr. Lee S. Huizenga as LaGrave's missionary to China. **The flowers on the chancel** commemorate the first missionaries from the CRC to China – Rev. John DeKorne, Rev. Harry Dykstra, and Rev. Lee S.
