Music at LaGrave: (11:00)

Keep Your Lamps originated as a slave song improvised following the hearing of a sermon based on Matthew 25. Through repetition, the music and text remind us to always be ready for Christ’s coming. Jesus was a deliverer and hope for slaves. Through the singing of this song, the slaves undoubtedly experienced deliverance from bondage. Andre Thomas (b. 1952) is a preeminent American conductor, clinician and arranger of spirituals. This arrangement would not be complete without the rhythmic conga drum accompaniment.

The banners and parament reflect the message from Isaiah 9:6, “The people walking in darkness have seen a great light.” In Advent we celebrate the coming of Jesus Christ. Jesus breaks through the world’s darkness with his glory, bringing us the light of salvation.

This Sunday morning our guest minister is **Dr. John Rottman**. John is a LaGrave member and the recently retired professor of preaching at Calvin Seminary.
