Epiphany is the liturgical season from Christmastide to Lent. During this time, we focus on Jesus Christ, the Savior, who is the manifestation of God’s light in our dark and sin-filled world. These concepts are reflected in the symbol of the Trinity and the gold and white colors used in the banners and paraments.
