Music at LaGrave (11:00)

Cathy Moklebust's handbell piece *Festival Sanctus* is full of joy and exuberance with an underlying eighth-note rhythm through the duration of the entire piece. Although the piece is not based on a pre-existing melody, the title of the work evokes the Sanctus text of the Catholic Mass (Sanctus is translated "holy"), expressing praise to the God of glory who rules in power over the whole earth. The piece is in three sections: an opening section that introduces the main theme, a quieter section in a bit slower tempo and in a new key, and the return of the opening material in the original key.
