**Rev. Scott Hoezee** is the Director of the Center for Excellence in Preaching at Calvin Theological Seminary.

Pentecost closes the Easter Season and symbolizes a new beginning with the coming of the Holy Spirit. Red is the traditional liturgical color for Pentecost. The dancing flames symbolize the Holy Spirit which came as "...what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them" (Acts 2:3 NIV). The church celebrates Christ's fulfillment of his promise to send his Spirit and grows in its understanding of its mission to spread to the world the good news of the gospel.

#### **Music at LaGrave**

The ancient 8<sup>th</sup> century hymn *Veni Creator Spiritus* (Come, O Creator Spirit, Come) is heard in both the prelude and the introit. Many organ composers wrote arrangements on this Gregorian Chant melody, including French Parisian organist Maurice Duruflé (1902-1986). His chorale variations conclude an extensive work titled *Prelude, Adagio and Chorale Variations on Veni Creator*. The choirs sing the unison chant melody in this morning's introit, invoking the Holy Spirit of Pentecost.

The flowers on the chancel today are given by William Stroo, Tom, Heidi, and Hannah Glover, Hillary and Dirk Tanis, and Dirk and Maria Glover, in loving memory of Marilyn Stroo, who would have celebrated her 80<sup>th</sup> birthday on May 26. Remember to take time to care.
