Ordinary Time is the liturgical season from Pentecost to Advent. This season for spiritual growth is represented in the liturgical colors of blue and green. The banners and paraments reflect concepts from Psalm 1. Like trees firmly rooted by the stream, we strive to be firmly rooted in God's Word. By doing so, we find life, experience deep spiritual growth, and are encouraged to live grateful lives.

Music at LaGrave

Felix Mendelssohn's *Hear My Prayer (O for the Wings of a Dove)* is based on verses from Psalm 55, a supplicatory Psalm pleading for God to hear us in our distress during life's darkest times. The analogy of flying away on the wings of dove to the safety of God's shelter is from Psalm 55:6-8. Mendelssohn paints this text by composing an

ascending melodic line depicting the dove rising higher and higher. The anthem, originally composed for soprano solo, chorus, and organ or orchestra, concludes quietly and "at rest" in quiet tranquility.

Today's chancel flowers are placed by **Carl and Sandy Gronsman** in loving memory of our son **Christopher** who went to be with his Lord seventeen years ago this week.
