Christian contemporary singer and songwriter Phil Wickham wrote *Hymn of Heaven* in early 2022 and it has quickly become very popular, having won a Dove Award in 2022 for the Worship Recorded Song of the Year. Written in a hymnlike style, both the song's verses and chorus echo many passages in Revelation, recounting the vision of heaven. In the songwriter's words, "The song is all about bringing

heaven to this moment, with the way we act, and the way we speak, and the way we live, letting Jesus be the King and his rule and his way taking over."
