Music at LaGrave

When studying in The Netherlands in 1954, LaGrave member Dr. Howard Slenk became a friend of Dutch organist and composer Jaap Dragt (1930-2003). Dragt composed some organ pieces based on Genevan Psalm tunes and dedicated them to Howard, including Psalm 1 played in this morning's prelude. Another Dutch organist, Jan Zwart, composed the postlude based on Psalm 150, which concludes with the Genevan tune heard on the full organ in a broad tempo.

The flowers on the chancel today are placed by **Marge Hoogeboom** in loving memory of her husband **Tom Hoogeboom**, who went to be with his Lord and Savior seven years ago today.
