We are encouraged to continue our growth in the knowledge of our Lord, Jesus Christ and experience his grace. As we do, we will be prepared to face life's challenges and remain firm in our faith. #### **Music at LaGrave:**

Henry Alford's 19th-century text *We Walk by Faith and Not by Sight* recalls the story of Jesus appearing to doubting Thomas who needed to touch the Risen Christ's hands and side in order to believe. Alford was a British clergyman and author of several hymn texts. American organ and choral composer David Lasky wrote an arrangement of the hymn tune used for this text, also from the 19<sup>th</sup>-century. Lasky features the hymn in unison, two and four-part harmony, and a final verse with a soaring soprano descant portraying the glory of beholding the face of Christ in heaven.
