Music at LaGrave (8:40)

Dan Forrest (b. 1978) has become one of the leading church music composers of our time. One of his most beloved anthems is an arrangement of Charles Wesley's timeless text from 1738, *And Can It Be That I Should Gain?* While Forrest's pianistic gifts are shown in the beautiful piano accompaniment, his gift for melody is evident in the flowing melodic lines sung by the choir. Like Wesley's prolific output of more than six thousand hymn texts, Forrest's growing body of works are contributing enormously to the Church's mission.

The flowers on the chancel today celebrate the 95th birthday of **Faith Hondorp** on October 21, 2023 and are given by the **Phil Huizenga family.** Faith is a lifelong member of LaGrave! Thanks be to God.

The October special offering is for Roosevelt Park Ministries.
