And it reminds us of our need for humble self-examination and sorrowful repentance before God.

Music at LaGrave:

The text of the anthem *I Will Lift up My Voice* references several verses from the Psalms: 100:4; 30:11-12; 95:1; 96:11-12; 30:5. This bright, rhythmic and energetic anthem is written using many mixed meters (time signatures), adding to the exuberance of the piece. The music softens and creates a contrasting mood at the words "Sorrow may abide for a

time, weeping may remain for a night, but joy cometh in the morning."
