

The Future of GROWING YOUNG

Heidi Glover and I traveled to Houston Texas at the end of February to attend the 2-day Growing Young Workshop, hosted by the Fuller Youth Institute. Growing

Young is research that identified 6 core commitments churches need to practice in order to "grow young." To "grow young" means the church is empowering and prioritizing young people ages 15-29 so their faith identity, sense of belonging at church, and purpose in light of the Gospel story is known and experienced. The 6 core commitments are:

1. Unlock Keychain Leadership empower others, especially young people.

2. Empathize with Today's Young People - listen to the next generation rather than judging them.

3. Take Jesus' Message Seriously - put the Gospel at the center and welcome young people into a Jesus-centered life.


4. Fuel a Warm Community - aim for fostering a space where warm relationships and intergenerational friendships can form.

5. Prioritize Young People (and Families) Everywhere - look for creative ways to include young people in all facets of church life, not just in the youth ministry.

6. <u>Be the Best Neighbors</u> - enable young people to neighbor well locally and globally.

Heidi and I chose to attend this workshop because Growing Young has been pursued at LaGrave for many years. Most recently, a subcommittee of Youth Education served for 2 years and worked to dream, implement, and share information regarding Growing Young. While they did a fantastic job working the language into the life of the church and continuing the Growing Young conversation, they were limited in their power because they were volunteers. Because of that, I began wondering what it would look like to train staff in this area and create a staff team that focused on Growing Young. This wondering led to Heidi and I signing up for and attending the workshop.

While we were there, we learned more about the nuances of the 6 core commitments and heard how other churches are implementing them in



their communities. We brainstormed with others about next steps, specifically in the areas of unlocking keychain leadership and empathizing with young people today. We talked about how LaGrave is very good at taking Jesus' message seriously, but there are other core commitments that require our time and energy. In the end, the leaders of the workshop encouraged us to put a date on the calendar for our next faithful step. After wrestling and discussing it, Heidi and I decided it would be best to create a staff team of 7 people, across different areas of ministry, that will meet regularly to discuss Growing Young and how it can influence our church community through different events and opportunities. Our first meeting is March 18. We appreciated the way the workshop pushed us to take home a practical next step and we are grateful for the Holy Spirit's guidance during our time at the workshop.

While the workshop took up a lot of our time, we also had time to eat good food including empanadas and Texas barbeque, walk around Hermann Park, and get a break from Michigan winter and read our books in the sun and 75 degree weather. We want to thank LaGrave for financially supporting our continuing education and encouraging us to grow in our areas of ministry. This trip was meaningful and we are excited to continue the Growing Young journey at LaGrave.



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Catching Up on the Neighborhood Activity

Panhandling and Camping

In August we experienced an increase in activity on Sheldon Boulevard. The city cracked down on

camping in city parks and on city property. Folks brought tents over to the Boulevard, hoping to camp there. Our partnership with the Grand Rapids Police Department was very fruitful - several officers helped keep the boulevard clear and clean. The city passed several new ordinances that impact the neighborhood around us. The ordinances allow LaGrave to limit the amount of panhandling in our parking lot and we have permission from the city to dispose of excessive personal property left unattended on our private property.

Fence Around SDA Building

Excessive personal property left on our property as well as loitering and inappropriate behavior are some of the reasons the Facilities committee chose to fence the yard around the SDA building, 100 Sheldon. The decision to fence the property was not about closing up and keeping neighbors out. It was about keeping vulnerable neighbors safe; keeping drug use off our property; making the yard a nice space for our neighbors in Ferguson Apartments to look at. So far it seems as though the fence is a successful deterrent to inappropriate behavior and abandoned personal property.

New Open Door Shelter

Earlier this year, Dégagé Ministries announced the opening of a new 25 bed housing unit for the most

complex guests of the Open Door Shelter. Thelma Ensink. Director of Dégagé says, "This program will be located at 129 lefferson, а building owned by Trinity Health, and is specially designed to provide support for their complex needs, providing mental and healthcare physical



on-site for up to 30 women in collaboration with Network 180 and Catherine's Health Center. Housing these women will not only transform their lives, but will also allow Dégagé to provide better service to the current patrons in the Open Door Women's Shelter. While women with these complex needs are 10% of our total shelter population, they often utilize 60% of our staff time. This project will also provide valuable data which will help our community reduce the number of people who experience chronic homelessness.

Warming Center

For those of you who haven't heard yet - The Vault has been open 8:303:00 pm Monday-Friday for up to 40 women from Dégagé to occupy during the coldest winter months. The dream of this partnership came in October when a group of city organizers gathered to discuss options for warming day centers from December through March. Dégagé secured funding through grants and philanthropy to lease The Vault from us, to staff the warming center, and to oversee the set-up, tear down, and cleaning of the space. On behalf of Dégagé, I want to thank those of you who attend groups that are momentarily displaced from The Vault so that the space can be used for the warming center. It has been a successful partnership so far and another great opportunity for LaGrave to share space with our neighborhood.

Dégagé Voucher Program

want to thank the Welcoming Ι Committee for their initiative to provide Dégagé Vouchers for LaGrave families to distribute around town. These vouchers are a \$2 value for patrons to use in a variety of ways. Dégagé serves more than 1000 unique individuals in a year through more than 20 emergency, empowerment, and engagement programs. With a voucher, a patron can purchase a full meal, get a state ID, do some laundry, have a shower, or purchase essential hygiene items. The vouchers are a helpful tool to greet neighbors on a Sunday morning. Some may be in the parking lot only looking for cash - offer them a voucher. Some may be in the narthex or multi-purpose room looking for a warm welcome. Ask their name, find out where they stay, welcome them to have a cup of coffee. Please remember that I care about your safety and will never ask you to take a dangerous risk. If you ever feel stuck in a situation that is overwhelming, please grab a security volunteer, or a facilities member, or me. I am available all week long so you may always invite a neighbor to come back on a different day to meet with me. My cards are available at the welcome center and in the church office.



Heartside Ministry Update

HEARTSIDE MINISTRY

Heartside is one of the local ministries supported by LaGrave's Evangelistic Outreach Committee. The Ministry, which became part of Mel Trotter in 2020, is focused on serving anyone experiencing hunger and homelessness in the greater Grand Rapids community. They meet our neighbors' basic needs through meals, showers, and shelter from the elements. Heartside also helps connect individuals to community resources, housing, employment, and means of obtaining vital documents. In addition, they offer an art ministry program and are having a fundraising auction in April with art from Heartside guests: www. meltrotter.org/events/art-and-experience-auction/. In 2023, the Heartside Ministry Day Center moved from 200 Division Ave to 225 Commerce Ave on the Mel Trotter campus to better serve the community and its guests. The same radical hospitality is still provided, just in a different location. Support from their partners, whether through volunteering or giving, helps sustain Heartside Ministry. Most of all, they ask for your prayers that God would continue to bless their work on behalf of the marginalized.

Hispanic Outreach By The Henry Beets Cuba Committee

In 1959, 65 years ago, the LaGrave Congregation embarked on supporting a new evangelism outreach to a group of Hispanic churches in Cuba. With the direction from the Henry Beets Cuba Committee, the churches survived and grew under Communism into the Cuba Christian Reformed Denomination. This connection between LaGrave and the Cuban Christians continues to be very strong.

One year ago, the president of the Cuban denomination, Yordanys Diaz, was forced because of safety concerns to leave Cuba with his family. Because of the historic support and knowledge of LaGrave, the family established asylum residency in Grand Rapids. The family are now members of LaGrave. This year, the LaGrave congregation has again embarked on support of a new Hispanic ministry. That ministry is not in a foreign country but in Grand Rapids. Lee Street CRC has an established Hispanic outreach program to their neighborhood community. Since leaving Cuba, Yordanys and family have been involved with that Lee Street ministry. With God's direction, Yordanys has found a new role in our community. With his talents, enthusiasm, and ministerial focus and with the financial support of LaGrave, Yordanys has now assumed an important Hispanic outreach position at Lee St. This new extension of service sponsored by Lagrave will provide our church with a new opportunity to join with evangelism efforts to a new population of our neighbors. 'In the City Under the Cross" has found a new opening for service.

Four Prayers For The Abused and The Abuser

In 2012, LaGrave's council commissioned the LiveSafe team and gave them the mandate to create preparedness in the event that allegations of abuse are made within the church. The reality of abuse has, at times, been highlighted in news headlines, and we are not unaware. Statistics tell us that one out of three women and one out of four men will experience some form of violence. Violence in our culture seems to be growing unchecked. Indeed, in our broken world, violence begets violence, and the abused becomes the abuser. These cycles are vicious, but we are not powerless against them. Prayer is a tool God gives us to bring our lament and our requests before him. If you find yourself or a loved one living in the presence of abuse, the LiveSafe Team offers you four prayers to pray.

PRAY FOR DISCERNMENT

God of infinite wisdom, we pray for those caught in abusive cycles. They exist in the presence of blinding emotions: anger, fear, shame, guilt. Those caught in the cycle of abuse may not be able to discern between a prosperous future and survival for another day. God of wisdom, open their eyes and ears to practice discernment.

PRAY FOR FREEDOM

God, our master, we pray for those who are enslaved by violence rather than you. You created us with the agency for human development. Our loved ones caught in abuse are shackled by that which degrades and diminishes them. May they sense your image welling up in them. May your love for them break the chains that bind them.

When God answers our prayers and when He blesses the abused or the abuser with discernment, freedom, courage, and healing, our loved ones will experience renewed hope found in God's presence in their lives. It may not be the hope we would have for them; however, it will be a hope given by God and worked out through their faith in our God.

Spiritual First Aid Training

Wheaton College's Humanitarian Disaster Institute has developed a new curriculum for Christians concerned about responding practically and helpfully to those around them facing crisis. The curriculum is called Spiritual First Aid.

This spring, LaGrave's Pastoral Care Committee will offer a 5-week, Sunday morning training for those who would like to be prepared to recognize the signs of trauma in others and step in with "first aid" while accessing additional resources for ongoing support

Through this training, we would like to identify and train people in the church who could walk with another member of the congregation for a defined period of time as a volunteer Care Partner. Care Partners would provide prayer support, emotionally informed company, and awareness of other helpful resources to a non-homebound member of the LaGrave community walking through a challenging stretch of life. Those who would like to participate in this training as new council members or as youth workers are also encouraged to sign up.

Spiritual First Aid Training will be held from 10:00 am to 12:00 pm on Sunday mornings this spring: April 28, May 5, May 12, May 19, and June 2 (Memorial Day weekend is off). You can attend 8:40 worship, participate in training, and be home in time for lunch.

New Sanctuary Speakers

Our new sanctuary audio speaker system has been installed. The new system was custom-designed to fit LaGrave's sanctuary acoustics by D&B Audiotechnik, a German company recognized for its innovative speaker systems. The system was installed by LiveSpace, a leading audio integrator.

We had to wait more than a year for the system to arrive. It was worth the wait.

The system is designed to project spoken words evenly and clearly throughout the sanctuary. The front speakers are thin columnar arrays, directing sound throughout the front half of the sanctuary. Two more speakers are installed about halfway back in the sanctuary, and also two more speakers that serve the balcony. These middle and balcony speakers are electronically delayed so they do not conflict with the front speakers.

Our old speakers (the big black boxes hanging from the sanctuary ceiling) were reaching the end of their projected useful life. Many members, particularly senior members, reported having an increasingly hard time hearing and understanding what our ministers were saying during sermons and prayers. Since the new system was installed, that situation has improved. People are finding it easier to understand words spoken during worship.

Funding for the new speaker system came from LaGrave Benefactors Trust. That trust fund was created by friends and members of LaGrave Church in part to help finance special projects like this one. We are grateful to the fund's trustees for their support of this project.










*Heat map analysis of sound coverage in the sanctuary with new system
