The liturgical season of Easter is the fifty days from Easter to Pentecost. The white, gold, and crystals used in the paraments and banners reflect the glory of the resurrection. Jesus Christ, the King of kings, has won the victory over sin and death!

Music at LaGrave (11:00)

The hymn tune EBENEZER originated as the second movement of an anthem titled "Light in the Valley" by Welsh composer Thomas Williams (1869-1944). The tune name Ebenezer is from the chapel in Rhos, Wales where Williams attended at the time he wrote the tune. His primary vocation was in the insurance business, but he wrote several hymn tunes and also played the organ and directed choirs. Though the hymn is characterized by many triplet rhythms, this morning's handbell arrangement replaces the triplets with "straighter" rhythms, creating a march-like setting.

Today's altar flowers are given in loving memory of Eve Meeter by her friend/son, Paul Wright. Eve loved Jesus Christ and God, the Father. Eve also loved her LaGrave church family, conversations with them and spiritual fulfillment from weekly services. A Bible verse Eve lived by was: "Thou dost keep him in perfect peace, whose mind is stayed on thee, because he trusts in thee. Trust in the Lord forever, for the Lord God is an everlasting rock." Isaiah 26:3-4

The April special offering is for Family Promise, who partners with local congregations, individuals, families, foundations and corporations to provide emergency shelter

and case management for families with children facing a housing crisis.

This evening, Rev. Jonker will preach on Genesis 1:26-31, and The Chamber Choir from Grand Rapids Christian High School is our guest choir.
