The King's Brass, formed over four decades ago in Detroit, is comprised of professional musicians from across the country who desire to use the instruments they love to lead others in praise and worship, all for the glory of God. Based in Fort Wayne, Indiana, the group plays over 150 concerts annually from coast to coast as well as international destinations. This year, the King's Brass celebrates its 46<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Season with a trip to the Holy Land in March of 2025. We welcome these fine musicians to worship this morning.

**Ordinary Time**, the longest liturgical season, is a time of spiritual growth. The banners are hung in the diptych form but instead of being attached together they are side by side yet separated. Many of the pieces in The King's Brass repertoire are hymn-based pieces arranged by former or current members of the ensemble, and such is the case with this arrangement by Dan Marvin. Deb Alley serves as pianist for this piece.
