With joy we grow spiritually by being rooted in God's word.

Music at LaGrave:

The words of John 15:5-17 are paraphrased in Mark Patterson's anthem *I Am the Vine*. Lyrical melodic lines, key changes, and an obbligato flute part contribute to the anthem's beauty and expressiveness. Patterson is a nationally recognized composer, conductor, and teacher who is currently Director of Music at Salisbury Presbyterian Church in Midlothian, Virginia where he leads a comprehensive music program for all ages.
