The Advent banners and parament reflect the message from Isaiah 9:6, "The people walking in darkness have seen a great light." In Advent we celebrate the coming of Jesus Christ. Jesus, the light of the world, breaks through the world's darkness with his glory bringing to us the light of salvation. The Advent Wreath is a circle which reminds us of God who is eternal with no beginning and no end. The four ring candles represent the light of God coming into the world. They also represent the period of waiting during the four Sundays of Advent. The pink candle symbolizes the joy of the eminent coming of the Christ. The white, center candle is the Christ candle. It reminds us that the incarnation is the heart of the

Christmas season. Jesus, the light of the world, comes into the darkness of our lives and brings new life and hope.

The flowers on the chancel today are given in loving memory of Rev. Herman Keizer from his wife, Ardis Keizer. Seven years ago Herman met his Savior whose name he proclaimed all his days.
