Epiphany is the liturgical season from Christmastide to **Lent.** During this time we focus on Jesus Christ, the Savior,

who is the manifestation of God's light in our dark and sinfilled world. As we grow in knowledge of God's redemptive acts through Jesus Christ, we are called to respond by bringing the light of the gospel to our neighbors and the world. These concepts are reflected in the symbol of the Trinity and the gold and white colors used in the banners and paraments.

Music at LaGrave (11:00): Carolina Sandell Berg was Sweden's greatest hymn text writer in the second half of the 19th century. As a child, she was bedridden with paralysis, but experienced a miraculous healing and went on to write several hymns of trust in God's loving power. The consoling text of *Children of the Heavenly Father* is just one example of her creative work. Mack Wilberg, music director at Utah's Mormon Tabernacle, heightens Carolina's text through a beautiful and contemplative anthem of peace and consolation.
