Thomerson also wrote the music for her hymn. Tom Trenney, Minister of Music and Organist at First-Plymouth Church in Lincoln, Nebraska, composed a beautiful choral arrangement of this hymn that is full of lush harmonies, an exciting crescendo just prior to a peaceful ending, and a flowing piano accompaniment.
