Lent is the liturgical season beginning with Ash Wednesday to Easter Sunday. The ash-permeated sackcloth reminds us of our human mortality and our need for repentance and reconciliation with God. The ash sackcloth against the royal purple cloth symbolizes the suffering and sorrow that Jesus the King bore for the sin in our broken world and our own lives.

Music at LaGrave: (11:00): Hope College graduate Susan Bentall Boersma is a published sacred lyricist who has collaborated with several prominent choral composers. Let All the People Praise!, her paraphrase of Psalm 148, is a collaborative work with Craig Courtney. Combining children's and youth choirs, adult choir, handbells, and piano, this festive piece is a celebration of all generations praising the God who is the same forever. The hymn O God, Our Help in Ages Past is also inserted into the anthem, a paraphrase of Psalm 90.

The March special offering is for God's Kitchen. God's Kitchen is part of Catholic Charities under the Diocese of Grand Rapids. They served over 175,000 meals to people downtown Grand Rapids last year.

This evening, Pastor Jonker will preach on Matthew 18:15–20.

Jesus' Journey to the Cross: The artwork of Scott Erickson, is in the church sanctuary. Each of the twelve stylistic pieces is constructed using signs and symbols that represent a concept or event in Jesus' journey to the cross. redemption. Then, consider the peace that is yours because Jesus has paid for all your sin. The installation begins in the back of the sanctuary on the LaGrave side and continues around to the parking lot side. A meditation guide is available in the wall box by the piece numbered I (one). This art installation is open weekdays during church office hours, Sundays before & after each church service, and Wednesdays during evening event hours. You're invited to use this installation to deepen your spiritual journey this Lenten season.
