

Thank you for joining us in worship this Palm Sunday! You may leave your palm branches in the large containers in the narthex.

**Palm Sunday** marks the beginning of the last week of Jesus' life on earth. Purple, the color of royalty, and the palm branches used in the paraments and banners symbolize the triumphant entry of Jesus the King of kings into Jerusalem.

Music at LaGrave: (11:00): The message of the African American Spiritual *Ride On, King Jesus* offered hope and triumph for slaves who had visions for a better life either on earth or, ultimately, in heaven. The text references both the Old Testament with themes of a "highway" in Isaiah 35 & 40, and the New Testament through the triumphal entry recorded in the gospels and Christ riding on a milk-white horse (a symbol of Christ's return) found in Revelation 19. The deep hope, anticipation, and joy of the spiritual is conveyed through syncopation, staccato notes, accented chords, and shaking technique in this morning's handbell arrangement.
