The liturgical season of Easter is the fifty days from Easter to Pentecost. The white, gold, and crystals used in the paraments and banners reflect the glory of the resurrection. Jesus Christ, the King of kings, has won the victory over sin and death!

Music at LaGrave: Keith Getty describes his modern Easter hymn See, What a Morning as a "Story song that depicts moments in the life of Jesus and their significance for all humanity." This rich text shares the story of Christ's resurrection. Keith and co-writer Stuart Townend write, "We really wanted to convey the immediacy of the Easter morning experience, and how that morning changed history forever. The third verse is a response of praise as we realize the amazing consequence of Christ's resurrection for our lives." Arranger Steve Strite inserts several exclamatory "Alleluias" (using the theme from Beethoven's Ode to Joy) in his lively choral arrangement which concludes in a blaze of glory.

The April special offering is for Family Promise. Family Promise partners with local congregations, individuals, families, foundations and corporations to provide emergency shelter and case management for families with children facing a housing crisis.
