God is light; in him there is no darkness at all.



Lent is the liturgical season beginning with Ash Wednesday to Easter Sunday. The ash-permeated sackcloth reminds us of our human mortality and our need for repentance and reconciliation with God. The ash sackcloth against the royal purple cloth symbolizes the suffering and sorrow that Jesus the King bore for the sin in our broken world and our own lives.

Music at LaGrave: (11:00): Englishman Edwin Hatch (1835–1889) was an intellectual who lectured on early Christian history at Oxford. He had a simple faith, expressed through mostly one-syllable words in his hymn Breathe on Me, Breath of God. In Greek and Hebrew, the word for "Spirit" is the same as "wind, air, breath," thus the reference to "breath" in the hymn. This hymn is inserted in Marianne Forman's anthem Breath of God, which is part of a five-movement work titled Trinity: Our God of Hope and Help, a meditation on God's care for his children through the three persons of the Trinity.

The flowers on the chancel today are given in loving memory of **Eve Meeter** by her friend/son, **Paul Wright.** Eve loved Jesus, Eve also loved her LaGrave church family, conversations with them and spiritual fulfillment from weekly services. A Bible verse Eve lived by was Isaiah 26:3-4: "Thou dost keep him in perfect peace, whose mind is stayed on thee, because he trusts in thee. Trust in the Lord forever, for the Lord God is an everlasting rock."

The April special offering is for Family Promise. Family Promise partners with local congregations, individuals, families, foundations and corporations to provide emergency shelter and case management for families with children facing a housing crisis.

This evening, Chad Boorsma will lead worship, and we will have a "guest speaker"–Nicodemus who will share his experiences as recorded in the gospel of John.
