- 2. Take up your cross, let not its weight fill your weak spirit with alarm; his strength shall bear your spirit up, and nerve your heart, and brace your arm.
- 3. Take up your cross, heed not the shame, nor let your foolish pride rebel; your Lord for you the cross endured and fought the powers of death and hell.
- 4. Take up your cross and follow Christ, nor think till death to lay it down; for only they who bear the cross may hope to wear the glorious crown.
